### Minnesota Humanities Center Announces \$700,000 in Legacy Grants

#### For Immediate Release

**April 18, 2024—ST. PAUL, MN—** The Minnesota Humanities Center (MHC) announces 17 Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment awards totaling more than \$700,000 to organizations across Minnesota to support organizational capacity building. The following organizations were selected to receive an award:

MHC received 130 total applications totaling \$7,204,440.16 in requests for proposed projects. The average grant request is \$55,418.77. The application process was extremely competitive as the amount of funding requested by Capacity Building applicants was ten (10) times the amount of funding available. These grants, consistent with legislative intent, will support capacity building by facilitating staff training, assisting staff on grant writing and grant reporting, retaining nonprofit management experts and consultants, identifying strategic planning and community outreach goals, and assist with capacity building and fundraising capabilities.

“MHC is proud to support these organizations that are dedicated to operating more effectively by strengthening their infrastructure and building a foundation for long-term success. The demand to support capacity building needs across Minnesota communities is unprecedented, and very clear,” stated Kevin Lindsey, CEO of MHC.

## **About Clean Water Land & Legacy Amendment**

The Minnesota Legislature passed the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment (Legacy Amendment) in 2008 to ensure clean water, preserve opportunities for Minnesotans to enjoy nature, parks, and trails, and to appreciate arts and culture that exists within the State. The Legacy Amendment increases the state sales tax by three-eighths of one percent to create the Legacy Fund – 19.75% of the Legacy Fund is dedicated to the arts and cultural heritage fund.
